

**MEDICAL MISSION TO THE WHOLE MAN**

We just returned from a medical trip in Kenya that started July 6<sup>th</sup> and continued through the 31st. We teamed up with a medical mission hospital known as Kijabe Mission Hospital that was established by missionaries from England in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Our main objective was not only to treat patients physically, but also to touch their spiritual needs; therefore, we had pastors and church elders to preach and counsel them before they received the physical medical treatment. My daughter Eunice helped in the pharmacy department where they put together medicines. During that time, something special happened to her, and she will testify in her own words. Our Lord Jesus Christ never stops to amaze us - glory to his Holy name!

We had eight medical camps in four different locations – Molo, Njoro, IDP Camp (outside of Nakuru City), and the New Dawn Community in Laikipia. We assessed and treated at least 1500 patients and many more were counseled and taught in different matters including nutrition and hygiene. It was a tremendous accomplishment within a short time. We saw how God can use his people to accomplish what Jesus did when he walked on this earth. Not only did he preach, but he healed all kinds of sickness and fed the hungry. That is what we did and what we want to continue doing as World Christian Outreach teams go forth in the future, with you as part and partner.

You have made it happen through your prayers and support. You have given so generously to advance the Kingdom of God. Just as Jesus said - whatever we do to our fellowmen, we do it to him. There is a reward in heaven for us as long as we continue his mission.

We were also able to meet some of the 18 New Dawn graduates from the '09 and '10 classes that are waiting to join the best universities in Kenya. They are so grateful for what God has done to see them through and pass with highest scores in the National Exit Examinations. You can see the glory of God in their faces.

Thanks so much for making this happen! You have forever changed their lives! Those that had lost hope after losing their parents through various diseases or war now have hope that tomorrow will be better than today. Some are volunteering to teach in Elementary Schools and all are encouraging others. I was so proud of them and pray that God will continue to use these young people in a unique way.
